



ST HUGH'S SPORTS COLOURS

At St Hugh's we are very proud of our senior pupils and their contributions to the overall success of the school. The awarding of sports colours are one way of recognising pupils' efforts, achievements and ability in Year 8. Below are guidelines on how these colours are awarded:

SPORTS COLOURS

Colours will be awarded to a pupil in a specific sport if they fulfil *all* of the criteria below:

1. Reaching the required ability to represent the school at 1st team level.
2. Maintaining a positive approach and attitude to lessons and training sessions, working hard to develop their own ability and team performance.
3. Showing loyalty and commitment to the team, representing the 1st team as requested.
4. Having the right attitude and approach on match days both on and off the pitch. This includes behaviour when travelling to and from matches, during match tea.
5. Pupils have been a positive ambassador for the school and the sport acting as a role model for others to follow and emulate.

Although the awarding of colours is meant as a privilege for Year 8, in exceptional circumstances where a pupil has reached national level in Year 7, the school reserves the right to award colours.

GOLD COLOURS

Gold colours may be awarded at the end of a term to pupils who have already received colours and have fulfilled the below criteria:

1. They have reached an ability of excellence which although subjective may be in line with county standard (not necessarily playing for the county).
2. They have maintained the expectations and requirements set out in the above criteria for colours.
3. The decision of awarding gold colours lies solely with the member of staff in charge of the 1st team.
