<p>One day, Barney, a solitary little boy, falls into a chalk pit and lands in a sort of cave, where he meets 'somebody with a lot of shaggy hair and two bright black eyes' - whom he names him Stig. And together they enjoy some extraordinary adventures.</p>		
	<p><b>The Hobbit</b></p>	<p><b>J. R. R. Tolkien</b></p>
<p>The prequel to The Lord of the Rings tells the tale of Bilbo Baggins who sets of on an adventure with twelve dwarves and the wizard Gandalf to cross Middle Earth to rescue the dwarves treasure from the dragon Smaug</p>
